Graduated: From West Kildonan Collegiate in 2009

Scholarships Received: The Nellie & Ben Zaidman Memorial Scholarship from the Seven Oaks Education Foundation, and Advanced Early Admissions and an entrance scholarship with the University of Manitoba

Post-Graduation Path: Come September 2012, Keeley will begin her fourth year at the University of Manitoba, in her third year of the Biochemistry Honours program. In the meantime, she'll be spending her summer working in a biochemistry research lab at the University.

On Receiving Her Scholarships:

On Receiving Her Scholarships:
