The event was held on February 12th this year and it was quite the line up, kicked off by Catherine Hart, a teacher from West Kildonan and the Seven Oaks Teachers Association Vice President. Catherine did a solo act with her ukulele and set the mood for the night.

The Seven Oaks Fiddle Teachers followed with a few upbeat crowd-favourite songs that got the crowd stirred up. Semple Minds – a staff band from Governor Semple School – kept the good vibes going.

The Maples Collegiate staff choir, Maple Syrup, harmonized us through a couple of songs. Then Ecole Belmont, with their voyageur sashes, serenaded the crowd au français with their band, Franco Fun.

In former years, Maples Collegiate had bands named Graham Crawford and the Permanent Contracts or Aaron Usiskin and the Permanent Contracts. They did not disappoint the crowd as they put on a great display of rock n roll!

The show did not end with that though. The A's and B's (Steve Arnold and Dan Bresner) heated up the stage with songs by The Highwaymen and Blitzen Trapper, followed by the Amber Trails Dancers on the dance floor.

Ernesto & Shelley from Immigrant Services and the Adult Learning Centre serenaded the crowd with Elvis' Love Me Tender. Then the Nine-Fifties (a combination of all of the programs that run out of 950 Jefferson that included Immigrant Services, Wayfinders, the Adult Learning Centre and support staff from their programs) gave a big band experience, playing You Can't Always Get What You Want and Wagon Wheel.

That was followed by Lianne Fournier, from West St Paul, playing piano and singing Woodstock & Ritournelle.

The evening then saw the return of a favourite band called Brian and the O'Leary's. Heidi Presingular fronted the band with some rootsy vocals backed by awesome musicians from Amber Trails, Constable Finney and O.V. Jewitt.

The act that closed out the night was from Garden City Collegiate. They called themselves Johnny Utah and the Breaks and quickly had the crowd dancing and singing along with them. It was a perfect ending to a perfect night of high quality entertainment.

Along with the cabaret show, there was an amazing silent auction with over 30 high quality prizes including framed pictures, gravity chairs, mini-fridges, jets clothing and much, much more.
