

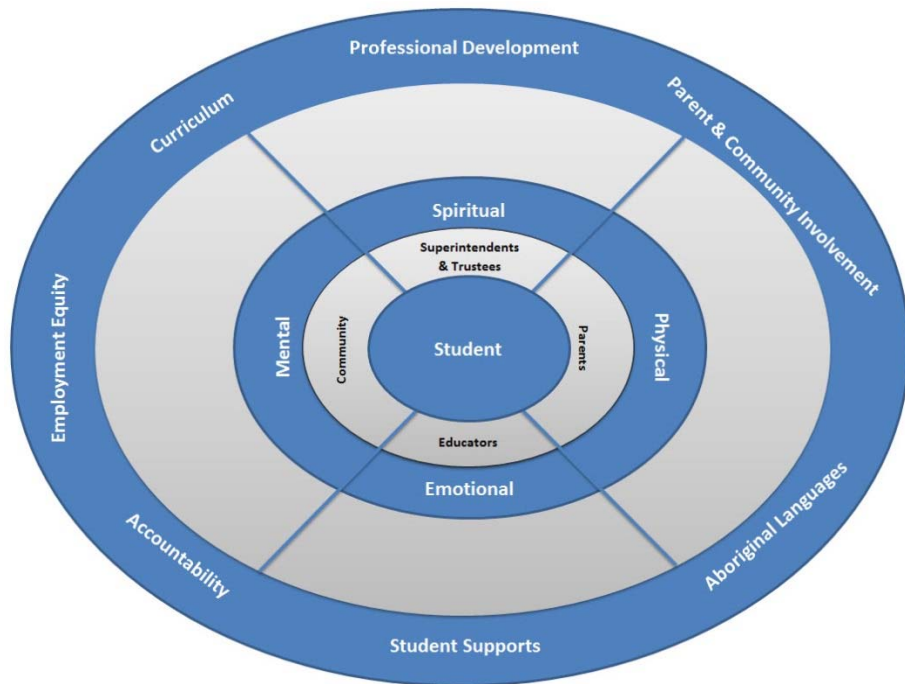
**ESTIMATED FEES for 2021-22 \***

## Growing Innovative Leadership

The Community Aboriginal Teacher Education Program was initiated by Seven Oaks School Division as a partnership between the University of Winnipeg and Winnipeg School Division. Indigenous people receive on-the-job training, work full time as Educational Assistants (EA) and attend University of Winnipeg to attain a combined B.Ed/B.A.

## Educational Assistant Component

We are committed to growing educational leaders as much as we want to certify Indigenous teachers. To achieve this end, we provide:

- Opportunities to take an active role as leaders within their schools as Indigenous Education Committee members and Divisional reps. for the Indigenous education PATH Working Group.
- Actively support Seven Oaks School Division Indigenous Education Policy.
- Opportunity to attend professional development and networking meetings to bridge between division, provincial and national initiatives.
- Contribute to the development of an Annual Indigenous Education Conference in partnership with the Council for Aboriginal Education in Manitoba (CAEM).
- Professional development designed specifically for CATEP students to stay abreast new resources, initiatives and changing trends.

We encourage CATEP students to naturalize the inclusion of culture and language, land-based, holistic, and experiential learning.

CATEP EA's work full-time from September to May at which time they are released to attend University full-time from May-August on an annual basis.

**We are seeking Cree and Ojibwe language speakers and those who have interest in learning their language as part of our language revitalization initiatives in order to grow Indigenous language speakers in our schools.**

## University Academic Component

The academic portion runs 11 month of the year from September to August.

Students attend University part-time <b>SEPTEMBER TO APRIL</b> (FALL/WINTER SESSION)
<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Attend classes one evening a week and two full Saturday's per month.</li></ul>
Released from EA position to attend university full time <b>MAY TO JULY</b> (SPRING/SUMMER SESSION) <i>Return as full-time employee in September</i>
<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Students attend classes full time minimum of three full days per week.</li></ul>

### CATEP Academic supports include:

- Small class sizes.
- Individual attention & support from instructors.
- Personal counselling and academic advising.
- A teacher-mentor established within the home school.
- Elder support within the university program.
- CATEP coordinator to assist with students needs.
- Practicum placements with supervision support.

Seven Oaks School Division covers the tuition and book fees for the first year. Students are responsible for all tuition fees and course supplies thereafter.
