- No cost to participants! We only ask for a commitment to treat everyone in the group with respect & courtesy.
- We promote reconciliation through equality of opportunity for all people.
- Each week there is a presentation on one aspect of our colonial history.

Each person is respected and given uninterrupted time to share and to listen.

Circles are offered in-person (where permitted) and via Zoom.
