Students in Kindergarten are enrolled in either morning or afternoon class.

Morning Kindergarten begins at 8:30 am and ends at 11:00am.

Afternoon Kindergarten begins at 12:30 pm and ends at 3:00pm.

At 8:00 a.m., educational assistants will be on duty outdoors to supervise children as they arrive for school.



If your child will be absent from school, please advise the school at 204-697-5962. You may leave a message.

Office Hours

The secretary's hours are from **7:45am to 3:30pm**. If attempting to contact the school before or after these hours, please leave a message. Messages are checked daily.

Registration

École Rivière-Rouge is a Kindergarten to Grade 5 French Immersion Milieu.



To register your child, you will need:

- Birth Certificate **or** Passport
- Manitoba Health Card
- Proof of address

Our secretaries will verify that this is the local school for your child based on your address (catchment area).

Medical concerns

If your child has any of the below medical concerns, your child is eligible for support from our divisional nurse. This includes providing the school with a healthcare plan which will help us to provide proper care for your child. Please let the office know and we will guide you through the process.



1. Life threatening allergy
2. Prescribed an Epipen
3. Asthma
4. Bleeding disorder
5. Diabetes
6. Heart Condition
7. Seizure Disorder
8. Other significant conditions

Medications at school



We understand that, at times, a medical practitioner will prescribe medication to a child that must be administered at school. If your child requires medication at school:

1. The medication must be delivered to the office by a parent or responsible adult.
2. We ask that the medication be in its original container.
3. An authorization form must be completed. Administration of Medication forms are available in the office.

We ask that all medications brought to school be stored at the office. This includes prescribed medication for asthma.

If your child has been prescribed an EpiPen for Anaphylaxis we ask that it:

1. **be carried in a fanny pack and remain with your child at all times OR**
2. **be stored at the main office.**

School fees



At the beginning of each school year, we collect a school fee of \$35.00 for students in grades 1-5 and \$30.00 for our Kindergarten students. This fee covers the cost of school supplies and field trips. Please pay by:

1. Cash in the exact amount
2. Cheque payable to École Rivière-Rouge
3. Online credit card payment through Parent Connect.

You will be issued a receipt upon receiving your payment.

Busing Information



If you require busing, you will need to complete a “Request for Transportation” form. These forms are available at the office.

Busing to and from school is free **as follows:**

- Children in kindergarten to grade 3 will be bused to and from school if they live farther than 1.2 km from the school, provided space is available.
- Children in grades 4 to 5 will be bused to and from school if they live farther than 1.6 km from the school, provided space is available.

Transportation fees for children who do not qualify for free transportation are indicated on transportation form.

In the event of bad weather, buses will be cancelled. School busing will be cancelled if the wind-chill reading is -45 or colder at 6:00 a.m. at the Forks according to Environment Canada. Notice of cancellations will be provided to media outlets and posted on school division websites as soon as the 6:00 a.m. reading is posted by Environment Canada.

Bus ridership is a privilege and can be lost if it is felt that a student's actions are not deemed safe.

When riding the bus, it is important we:

1. Remain seated at all times
2. Keep aisles clear
3. Respect safety zones
4. Demonstrate respect for our bus community by:
 - Keeping our voices at a reasonable level
 - Using appropriate language
 - Respecting the bus driver
 - Not eating on the bus

Twice yearly, the school participates in bus evacuation procedures for all students.

Field Trips



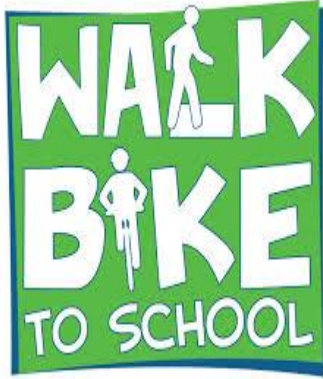

- ❖ If children are walking to school, we encourage them to use the sidewalk and cross only at intersections.
- ❖ An Educational Assistant is posted at the intersection of Murray and Swinford Way to assist with crossing safely. She/he is there in the morning (8:05am-8:25am) and in the afternoon between 3:00pm-3:15pm).
- ❖ Biking to school is a parental decision. Parents should assess the route and determine if their child has the skills to walk or bicycle on his/her own.
- ❖ Please assure that if your child bikes to school, he/she is wearing a helmet.

Classroom Communication

Recess

Outdoor play is a crucial part of a child's mental, physical and social development. It is valued as an important part of a child's school experience!

All children go outside for recess. For students in grades 1-5, there are two physical activity breaks scheduled throughout the day.

We will remain indoors when the temperature is -27 degrees C. or colder. (Environment Canada at the Forks).

Please make sure your child's footwear and clothing is appropriate for the weather. During the spring months, it is important to send your child with extra dry clothing, a raincoat and rubber boots. Sunshine, wind, snow and a little rain will not keep us indoors. This will be at the discretion of the supervisors. To help keep our school clean and for the comfort of all students we ask that students have one pair of shoes to wear indoors and one pair of shoes to wear outdoors.

Lost and Found

There are three small lost and found boxes located by the back entrance door in the foyer. Items that are not claimed before term breaks (December, March, and June) will be donated to a charitable organization.

Healthy Snacks and Lunches



Serving healthy snacks and lunches to children is important to providing good nutrition and supporting lifelong healthy eating habits.

Children are provided with two nutritional breaks every day. Snacks that are especially good for kids are fruits and vegetables, low-fat dairy products such as milk and yogurt, and whole-grain foods including whole-wheat tortillas, bread, and cereal.

Litter-lite lunches/snacks



We also encourage sending snacks and lunches that are kind to the environment. To help our school reduce waste production and our impact on the Earth, we encourage families to consider packing snacks and lunches in reusable containers.

End of the day routines

The dismissal bell rings at 2:55pm. When the bell rings, students are dismissed from their classrooms.

- Bused students line up in their bus line in the school foyer
- Students who walk or are picked up, also meet in the foyer. Younger students in grades k-2 should be met by a parent/guardian.

Please remember to alert the school of any busing changes for the day. Parents can send a written note with their child. If contacting the office to notify us of a change, we kindly request that this be done before 2:00pm. Parents should also inform Transportation at 204-338-7051.

Parent-Child Preschool Program



École Rivière-Rouge offers free preschool programs for parents/caregivers and their children from birth to five. We learn and play together through rhyme & story time, art, and a variety of play experiences, including play dough, sand, water, blocks, etc. We also have a nutritious snack!

The program runs on Monday afternoons from 1:00 pm to 3:00 pm, Tuesday mornings from 9:00 am to 11:00 am Wednesday mornings from 9:00 am to 11:00 am.
