Language revitalization is so important. Statistics show that language retention occurs at a greater rate when families learn together in a meaningful way. For this reason, we strongly encourage families to attend together!

This is a land-based Ojibwe summer language camp that will include many outdoor fieldtrips. For this reason, children under the age of 10 will have to be accompanied by an adult/guardian or support worker for the entire day – no exceptions!

This four-week program aims to learn within and alongside our community in a fun and experiential way.

Registration is on a first come, first serve basis. Space is limited – secure your spot today!

Participants will be immersed in language and cultural teachings through land-based activities.
