We strive to give children the tools to be agents of change in our community, and to absorb and express powerful messages through language. This year, our community welcomed Sandy Figueroa for a week-long residency, where teachers from both A.E. Wright and O.V. Jewitt had opportunities to observe, reflect on and apply powerful teaching practices. This work will continue in the 2023-2024 school year.

We believe that learning will be meaningful and authentic when it happens in connection with others in a community.
