In room 118, the students have been creating self portraits inspired by this art medium and technique. They started by painting the background colour with acrylic paint and then started blending and adding plasticine to create their portrait.









The kinders in room 120 have been busy learning letters in the alphabet. Here they are engaging in learning activities that have them building letters, hunting for letters and practicing writing letters. They have even made their own song for some of the letter sounds!


