





Mr. Turner's students explore Science through microscopes










IMPORTANT REMINDERS

Student Drop Off / Pick Up

Please remember that the staff parking lot is for staff only and cannot be used for pick up/drop off. The front parking loop is reserved for kindergarten and daycare families, as well as students who have mobility concerns. Please do not park/stop on left side of loop (fire lane). Parking passes are required to enter the loop. Please continue to park a minimum of one block away from the school to avoid traffic congestion.

The Start time for the school is 9.00 am and the bell rings at 8.55 am. However, it is observed that some students are not coming to school by 9.00 am. By coming late to school, students miss the morning announcements and assembly which is an important part to identify and connect with the school.

REMINDER TO PARENTS: Please make sure that all your children's belongings (clothes, lunch boxes, drink bottles, stationery etc.) that are brought to the office, should be labelled so that labelled property can easily be returned to its owner.

If your child needs to be picked up early from school, we request the parents call the school and inform who would be coming to pick up the child and call at least 15-20 minutes ahead of the pick-up time to give the student enough time to gather their belongings and come to the office. We also ask that parents (or any visitors) check in at the office and not go directly to the classroom. We will call the student to the office for their pick-up.
