#### **STUDENT DROP-OFF/PICK-UP**



#### LABELLING THE BELONGINGS:



## **Amber Trails Belief Statement & School Plan**

At Amber Trails School we believe that communities are more sustainable and mutually beneficial when we build upon relationships and responsibility to one another to ensure all our students benefit. At Amber Trails we recognize that everyone in our community can benefit from Indigenous education as it can enrich the experiences of all learners while supporting academic success for Indigenous learners. It is everyone's responsibility to incorporate Indigenous education in their lives and we commit to doing this work in our school.

Last year our school came up with a belief statement and a school plan that uses the Medicine Wheel and the Circle of Courage as a template. There are 4 parts in the Circle of Courage, and they are Belonging, Mastery, Independence, and Generosity. Belonging means we believe in fostering relationships based upon mutual trust and respect. Belonging makes us feel like "I am Loved." Mastery means we believe that all students can succeed. We want to provide opportunities to students to engage in critical thinking and deep learning. Mastery makes us feel like, "I can succeed." Independence means we believe in creating environments that empower and honour children's voices and choices. Independence makes us feel like, "I have the power to make decisions." Generosity means we believe in providing opportunities for students to share with others and bring meaning to their life. Generosity makes us feel like, "I have purpose."



Ms Martens' and Ms Thompson's classrooms have been discussing our school beliefs and the Circle of Courage. Through watching videos, reading articles, having deep conversations and writing reflections, they focused on the importance of "belonging".


They then designed and created artwork on fabric tiles to represent ways they feel like they belong on Amber Trails Community School. Some of the things listed are - GSA, BSU, Ukrainian club, sports teams, friends, land acknowledgements, and O'Canada being sung in different languages. The tiles will be sewn together to make a large "belonging" quilt and displayed in the hallway.
