

Polar Bear Club



What is Polar Bear Club? On days when the temperature is -28c or below, it is indoor recess. However, some children really want to get outside for a short time to burn off some energy. Polar Bear Club gives children an option to go outside on colder days.

What families want to know about Polar Bear Club?

- Children MUST be dressed in the appropriate outerwear (toque, mitts, boots, winter
 jacket, scarf or neck warmer and ski pants or second layer of pants). The school can
 provide outerwear items if children do not have them.
- Children are checked to see if they are dressed warm enough before heading outside.
- Children can choose to come in when they are cold.
- Children are closely supervised to ensure they are warm enough.

If your children are expressing an interest in going out on cold days, please help them come to school with winter outerwear or speak to us for support on clothing!



Welcome Back Remote Learners

At the height of Code Red and high case counts of Covid, Elwick School had 203 remote learners at home. Families have been sending the children back to school for in person learning and we are so excited to see 160 children returning back to school! It is so good to see more of our children back n classrooms.

Please note if your children are remaining in remote learning, regular participation is required. Children are welcome to return from remote to in person learning at anytime. Please just let the school know.



Kindergarten Registration begins Monday, February 22nd, 2021.

<u>Due to COVID-19, the 2021-22</u> Kindergarten registration will take place online.

For those families who are having difficulties applying online, they are to contact the school to make an appointment to register.

All children that are registering for Kindergarten <u>must be 5 years</u> <u>old by December 31st, 2021</u> (born in 2016) in order to register for Kindergarten starting in September 2021.

Immunization information from the WRHA will be made available online. Please ensure to share this information with those who call for appointment to register at their school.

You must provide:

- Proof of age
- Proof of address
- You must be the legal guardian to register the student.


WHATS HAPPENING AT ELWICK

Music Update



Feb. 16 will be a busy day for many students in grades 4 - 8... the music team will be bussing groups of students to SOPAC throughout the day to hold recording sessions in SOPAC (which will be compiled into a virtual concert vimeo link). The following student groups will be involved: Fiddle, Musical Theatre TAA, and Band. Also, Sistema students will record in SOPAC during the regular Sistema time. The music team is excited to have the opportunity for our students to do a recording session in this fantastic space!

On Mon. Mar. 8 students in gr. 4/5 classes will do a recording session of a couple musical performances (at Elwick). Ukuleles will be involved and likely some other instruments. A vimeo link will be shared after the performances are edited and compiled.



However, due to COVID restrictions, an alternative suggestion is to adapt Boissevain teacher Maisie Hole's virtual read-aloud month idea. Teachers are invited to invite local community members to take a video recording of themselves

reading their favourite children's book and then sending it in for the students to view.

Here are some suggested activities for students of all ages to have them explore different ways of engaging with literacy:

- Dress up as your favourite book character
- Set a reading goal for the month
- Explore getepic.com to listen to audiobooks or read digital books
- Sign up for a library card at the Winnipeg Public Library
- Create a list of your top 10 favourite books
- Buddy read with a family member
- Connect online with all of your family to play a game of trivia or Scrabble
- Celebrate I Read Canadian Day (February 17th) by reading a book by a Canadian author
- Create a page or two or your own graphic novel
- Become pen pals with a resident at a personal care home
- Create a bookmark that shows your love of reading


THEME OF THE MOUTH kindness

For the month of February, Elwick Community School is going to be learning about **KINDNESS!** Last month, we learned about digital citizenship and the type of people we want to be online. This month we will focus on how we treat each other both IRL (in real life) and online.

Our theme of kindness connects well with our school belief statement which states, "At Elwick School, we take care of ourselves, each other, this place and our world". To help make the world a better place, we have to be kind to ourselves, each other, our school and the world. Kindness is a skill that can be taught and practiced.

Examples of Kindness:

- forgiving yourself for a mistake
- giving someone a compliment
- celebrating another person's successes
- inviting someone to play a game with you
- cleaning up in your classroom
- picking up litter outside

According to *Edutopia*, acts of kindness help to make people feel good about themselves and this in turn increases serotonin levels. These important chemicals in our body help to positively affect how we learn, increase our memory, increase our mood and aid in sleep, health and digestion.

How can you teach your child to be kind?

Help them understand what kindness means.

Inspire their imagination: Pretend play is a great way for kids to practice empathy.

"How would you feel if that happened to you?"

Model kindness everywhere you go.


Encourage kind habits (sharing, listening, helping, supporting, volunteering, comforting, including).


