Positive Discipline

What it is and how to do it

We all know that parenting is a most rewarding, but challenging experience. Often we are presented with situations or behaviors in our children that leave us feeling confused, frustrated and unsure of how to respond.

Positive Discipline is an approach to parenting that teaches children and guides their behavior, based in research on children's healthy development and effective parenting.

Positive Discipline is not permissive parenting and is not about punishment. It is about long-term solutions that develop children's own self-discipline and their life long skills. Positive discipline is about teaching non-violence, empathy, self-respect, human rights and respect for others.

The 7-Oaks School Division will be offering a seminar on Positive Discipline in March and April, 2015. The seminars will start on Wednesday, March 4, 2015 in the morning from 9:15 am to 11:15 am and will run for 8 consecutive weeks. Childcare will be provided. The program will take place at the Ben Zaidman Educational Resource Centre (BZERC) at 375 Jefferson Avenue.

We had a great opportunity this year. We got to learn art at the Winnipeg Art Gallery. We went to the Winnipeg Art Gallery every Day 6 in the morning from September to the beginning of December. Even though we missed some late start days, it was still worth going. Our art teacher's name was Curtis. He had a crazy beard, but he was still a great artist and an awesome teacher!

We learned how to make sculptures out of clay. We had to shape our sculptures like animals. Curtis put them in the kiln to make them harden. We made big holes under the clay sculptures so when they were in the kiln they wouldn't explode. When they were done, we painted them to make them colourful.

We learned how to make shadow puppets. We used black pieces of paper to make them. First we drew our puppets and then we cut them out. We attached sticks to them to be able to move them and hold them on the screen. We used the light to make a puppet play. Curtis videotaped our puppet shows. It was difficult practicing, but it was fun.

We made lots of drawings. We learned about lots of shapes in our drawings. We also made a picture of a person so we can learn about proportions. We used oil paints, acrylic paints, and tempera paints, too. Oil paint is better to use for shading. We also learned about mixing colours. One of the biggest things we learned was that you have to take your time during your art. Don't rush. Be patient, take time and don't give up!

We visited the Salvador Dali exhibit for the last day of art class. It was fun! We got to see some of the many paintings that were painted by Salvador Dali. Some were small, some were as tall as a small house! We also got to see the pictures that Dali took of himself and his moustache in weird poses. It was fun, cool and artistic to see the paintings made by Salvador Dali.

We had so much fun learning how to make good art with Curtis. It almost didn't feel like school! It was sad to end our time there. Next, Mr. Raquin's class will be going to learn at the WAG. We are sure they will have a great time, too.


