




Notes from the Music Room

On Wednesday May 24, the students debuted their own renditions using a range of items such as basketballs, cups, and trashcans! The Gr. 4/5 Fiddlers kicked off the show by playing a variety of short, but catchy melodies. Following this, the small but mighty Ms. Henry's class performed a Chair Jam by Lamar Burkhalter. Who knew you could make such interesting sounds and beats with just the things we sit on! 
