A WORD FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Dear Elwick Families,



Standing in a sea of orange in St. John's Park yesterday felt historic. Even the leaves on tress were wearing orange to honour and remember the children, survivors and those who never came home from residential schools. This event was planned for 100 people and 12,000 came.

This historical first day of National Truth and Reconciliation reminds us that schools are powerful places that can do harm or do good.

All of us have been reminded of our responsibilities as Canadians not just to know the 94 Calls to Action from the TRC, but to take action. It is not enough to wear an orange shirt and march. As educators, we need to ensure that our schools are places where children see themselves reflected in the school community. Children should feel proud and honoured for who they are and where they come from. Children have the right to an education that allows them to thrive. Children's families should be honoured as the first teachers of their children and an integral part of their child's education. As the principal of Elwick School, this is my hope for all of our children who come here.

As a school community, we recommit ourselves to work in partnership with Indigenous families and communities. This is not just about one day or one week, but a commitment that is woven into the very fabric of the school community every day!

THEME OF THE MOUTH IDENTITY



IDENTITY CAN BE MADE UP OF:


- where you come from

Each one of us is unique and we value things differently. We can learn from each other even if we have different values. It gives us all a different way to see the world.

HOW CAN I HELP MY CHILD DEVELOP A STRONG SENSE OF IDENTITY?

The Victorian Early Years Learning Framework recommends:

- Value what is unique about your child and accept your child for who they are right now.
- Encourage your child to make choices and decisions (within appropriate limits). This recognises that your child is able to make decisions.
- When your child says 'I can do it' let them try. Support your child's efforts to be more independent (while still offering your guidance).
- Encourage your child to solve problems or to keep going when things get tough. This builds your child's resilience and sense of wellbeing.
- Help your child to learn how to treat others.
