

CREATING A SAFE AND CARING SCHOOL

Sistema continues to be a place where staff and students support each other. Music is often an outlet for students as a way to express themselves, whatever their mood may be. In Sistema, students have the opportunity to develop their musical and social skills promoting positive mental health. Students learn to work together in small and large group settings. One of Sistema's philosophies is to help each other. Pictured here is an example of our mentoring time when our more experienced students teach the less experienced ones.





FOCUSING ON INDIGENOUS EDUCATION

Sistema students were able to make Indigenous education a regular part of their schedule. Students were able to smudge before Sistema, participated in Pow Wow club, had drumming lessons and worked collaboratively with these groups towards a joint piece which will hopefully be performed next year. We performed at our school Pow Wow and were able to invite our Sistema friends from King Edward School to join in our Treaty Days. EDUCATION FOR SUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT

Elwick is only one of two schools in Manitoba that offer the Sistema Winnipeg program. This free program is an opportunity staff and students are committed to and understand the potential it could have in a student's life. Sharing our music and message by performing for different communities around the city, we are able to show people the power of music education and how it can help shape not only the students involved but also the community.
