
EDUCATION FOR Sustainable DEVELOPMENT





WE ARE DEVELOPING A STRONG ART APPROACH AND ARE CONTINUING TO BUILD OUR CAPACITY TO USE TECHNOLOGY IN ENRICHING AND EXCITING WAYS. THIS YEAR WE HAVE HAD SEVERAL DIFFERENT GROUPS OF TEACHERS WHO HAVE BEEN WORKING TOGETHER TO LEARN INDIGENOUS MATH ACTIVITIES, CREATE ENGAGING WRITING TASKS, AS WELL AS TO COLLABORATE ON IDEAS TO INFUSE INDIGENOUS PERSPECTIVES IN THEIR CLASSROOMS. THIS YEAR, AS A STAFF WE LEARNED ABOUT TREATY EDUCATION, OUTDOOR EDUCATION, SOME NEW DESIGN CHALLENGE IDEAS RELATED TO MATH AND SCIENCE, AS WELL AS LEARNED MORE ABOUT PROJECT 11.



This year at Elwick Sistema, sectional groups had the chance to create their own working treaty. When writing our treaties, the core values of taking care of ourselves, taking care of each other, taking care of this place, and taking care of our world were focused on. Talking about the treaties became a regular activity among students and gave them a better sense of how they can work together to create well-crafted performances of their music.

To be educated about Sustainable Development means to be able to know how we as individuals and groups affect each other and the world with our actions.
