


Priority: Indigenous Education (Reconciliation)

This continues to be very important to all of us at Forest park and we are intentional about bringing Indigenous perspectives to all we do during our day. We look to deepen our knowledge through a variety of experiences such as: P.D. Days; learning more about the Seven Teachings and how we can live them every day; finding literature that represents all of our children and by inviting elders to share their experiences with us. Our Powwow club continues to be an important source of pride for our entire community.




Priority: Literacy

Literacy takes many forms at Forest Park as our staff works to create authentic reading and writing opportunities that support learning. Students also show their learning through other experiences such as artwork, partner reading, on smartboards and on the computer. Media literacy is also an important focus as our world becomes more and more technologically oriented.



Priority: Numeracy

Children at Forest Park practice their numeracy skills in a variety of ways such as through coding, computer programs such as Mathletics and through real-world problem-solving such as planning a Family Night for families in the community. Our staff has become more and more capable of accommodating a wide range of student abilities, interests and prior experiences as they plan for all of our learners.



Priority: Student Well-being

Children at Forest Park learn many strategies that help them stay calm and focussed at school. We have several initiatives built into the school day to support student health and well-being such as Roots of Empathy, Yoga and Bangra Dance Clubs; Intramurals, our wonderful Therapy Dog “Checkers” and our GSA club. Our staff works hard to build relationships with all children so that they feel that they belong!



Priority: SUSTAINABILITY (Outdoor Education)

We were finally able to enjoy the fruits of all of the labour we have put into designing and building our outdoor nature space. Many teachers took on the challenge of bringing the curriculum outside and spending a day or even a week (or two!!) outdoors with their children. Students became engaged in our bike club, garden club and continue to develop a desire to take care of their world as they play and learn outdoors.
