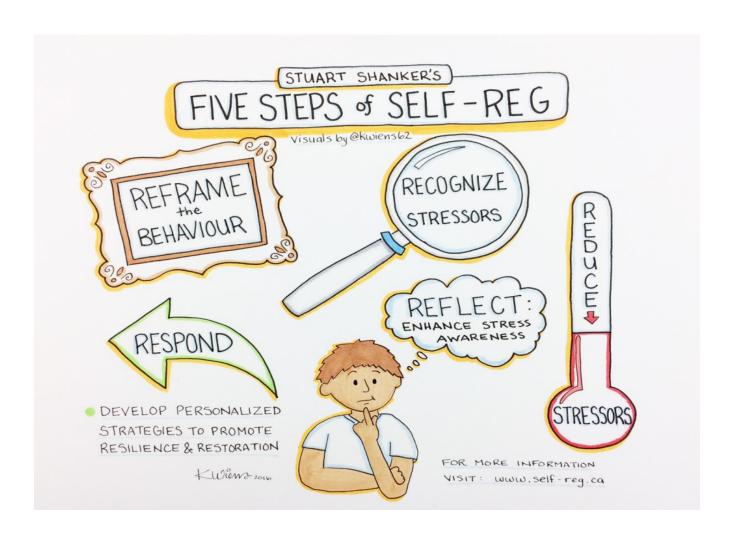
As a staff we have been focusing much of our professional learning on self-regulation. We have recognized that in order for children to learn best, they must be regulated, and have the regulation strategies to do so!

Today's Parent magazine describes Self-Regulation as this:

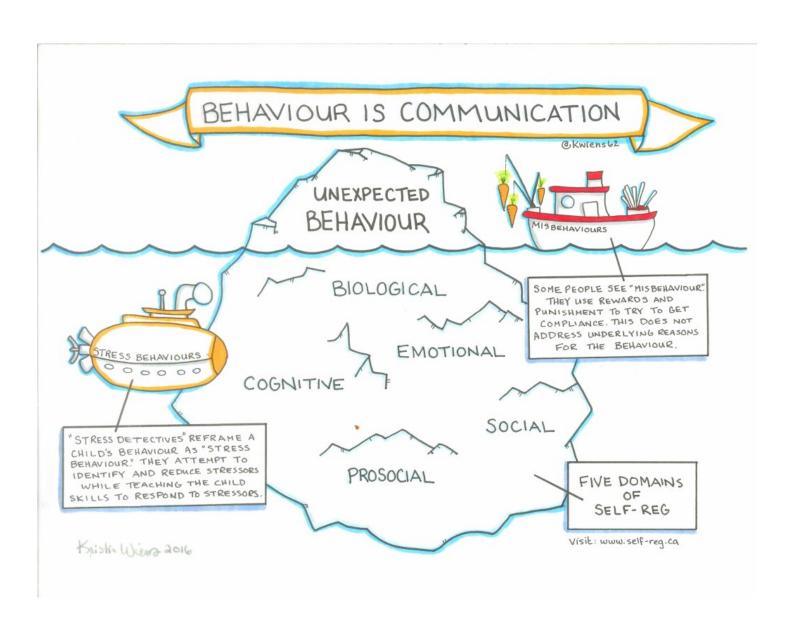
This is the ability to adapt your physiological, emotional and mental state to the task at hand. For instance, hockey players need to prepare for their games so that they're energized, excited and vigilant—ready to skate fast, react sharply and keep track of opponents. But in math class, children need to be calm, yet still focused and alert so they can listen to the teacher, absorb the material they're being taught, and apply it. Some studies are showing that children's ability to self-regulate is a better predictor of school success than IQ.

The work of Stuart Shankar has guided much of our learning and we have attached some of his most helpful pictographs. For more information, please refer to Dr. Shankar's website or speak with your child's teacher!

The pictograph below outlines the idea of behaviour as communication. It explores the five domain's of self-regulation and recognizes that when any of these domains are off balance, unexpected behaviour is not only possible but also quite likely. We know that when balance is achieved in all five domains, the possibilities are endless. Unexpected behaviour has also replaced our idea of misbehaviour. We recognize that when children use behaviour to communicate, we have to reframe our thinking. When children don't do, or are reluctant to do what is being asked of them, we have changed our perspective from thinking that children don't want to do something, to children not being able to do something. This has shifted our focus towards pro-active approaches rather than reactive strategies. The pictograph on the next page is a helpful reminder from Ross Greene that "kids do well if they can"!

At Governor Semple School, we believe that learning about Canadian history, Canadian present-day and Indigenous culture are important educational concepts for our staff and students.

The Indigenous world view refers to guiding principles and traditional values of Indigenous societies. It is a holistic process where learning takes place across spiritual, physical, emotional and mental dimensions. In supporting this work in our school, we will begin offering a daily smudge to all staff and students who are interested. This will take place first thing in the morning in one of two places, outside under our pergola or inside our library, which is a well ventilated area.

Smudging is a tradition, common among many Indigenous people which involves burning of one of more medicines gathered from the Earth. We will be using Sage. Smudging allows people to stop, slow down and become more mindful and centred. This allows people to let go of anything negative that they may be holding on to. The forms of smudging vary from nation to nation but are considered by all to be a good way of cleansing oneself.

A Smudge is led by a person who has an understanding of what a Smudge is and why we do it. We will be using a shell and the smoke is pushed forward from the shell using an eagle feather. When we smudge, we first cleanse our hands with the smoke as if we were washing our hands. We then draw the smoke over our heads, eyes, ears, mouth, and our bodies. These actions remind us to think good thoughts, see good actions, hear good sounds, speak good words and show the good of who we are. Students are encouraged to smudge the way that they feel most comfortable.

On Thursday, April 12th, Dan Thomas, our Elder in residence in Seven Oaks will come to lead our first smudge teaching for 9:00 am. All children will be invited to attend and any interested families are also encouraged to attend!
