The **Balanced Experiential Education Program (B.E.E.P)** is a **FREE** summer program for students in Grades I-5 at Governor Semple & Victory Schools. The program is run by certified teachers and provides hands-on learning activities, sports, art, music and cooperative games. The program is **FREE** and loads of fun and we hope that your child can attend! Our summer program runs from Tuesday, July 5th to Friday, August I2th (Monday to Friday from 9:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m.) B.E.E.P. registration forms have been sent home.

OUR SCHOOL WIDE-FEELINGS EXPLORATION

Since January we have been doing a school-wide exploration of the main feeling groups---

HAPPY, SAD, ANGRY, SCARED. (We did LOVE as an extra in February...a happy feeling that worked well with Valentine's Day and "I Love to Read" month.)

Each month we have highlighted one of these feeling groups on the front bulletin board, along with an opportunity for children and adults to write about when they get that feeling and how they manage to calm themselves. In addition a variety of classroom teaching ideas (reading, writing, discussion, art &drama activities) were provided for all teachers so they could work with that feeling in their class. Our librarian, Sara, and our counselor, Terry, provided books about the studied feeling as well as creating laminated, magnetized feeling faces for all classrooms. Sara is a person of many talents; she customized our feeling faces! Announcements were made related to feeling facts, children's ideas and strategies.

The most important teachings we have tried to convey are:

- We don't judge our feelings as good or bad; they just are.
- All feelings are to be respected.
- Our feelings are trying to tell us something; it's important to listen to them.
- Feelings visit; they don't last forever; they come and go; no feeling is final.
- We can welcome feelings like a special guest. Can we make friends with all of our feelings?
- Strong feelings lose some of their power when we accept them rather than deny them or push them down.
- Sometimes feelings are masked. For example, anger often covers fear or sorrow.
- If we're very angry or scared, we can't think very well; taking some deep breaths and being curious about something can help us start to think clearly again.
- It is important that we manage our strong feelings in healthy ways.

Our favorite strategies:

- Breathe! Science tells us that this is the simplest, most effective way to calm our body, mind and heart.
- Talking about our feelings is very helpful.
- Reading, drawing, writing, playing and music can take our minds off our troubles for awhile, giving us a much needed break.
- Hugs are a big favourite!
- Being curious and open can help us sort things out.
- And love---Love is a healing feeling. Can you breathe love into your heart?

A Feeling Movie: "Inside Out":

This movie is a fantastic vehicle for exploring feelings. Many of us at Governor Semple saw the movie... some more than a few times!

- It shows how the feelings had to work together and help each other so that Rylee (their person) could thrive.
- All feelings serve a purpose in the movie.
- By the end, all feelings are seen as helpful and serving a purpose.
- The children made some fascinating observations!
- If you have a chance to watch the movie together, we highly recommend it.
