
Anne Frank: A History for Today

## An International Travelling exhibition from Anne Frank House in Amsterdam.

On July 6<sup>th</sup>, 1942, Anne Frank, just thirteen years of age, became a fugitive, was joined by her parents and sister, hidden away in a secret factory annex in

Amsterdam. During her two years of hiding, Anne kept a diary, which has survived to become powerful symbol of a young girl's optimism and vision for a better world as she came of age in a time of terror. Her story is the experience of a young Jewish girl, growing up within the inhumanity of the Holocaust.
