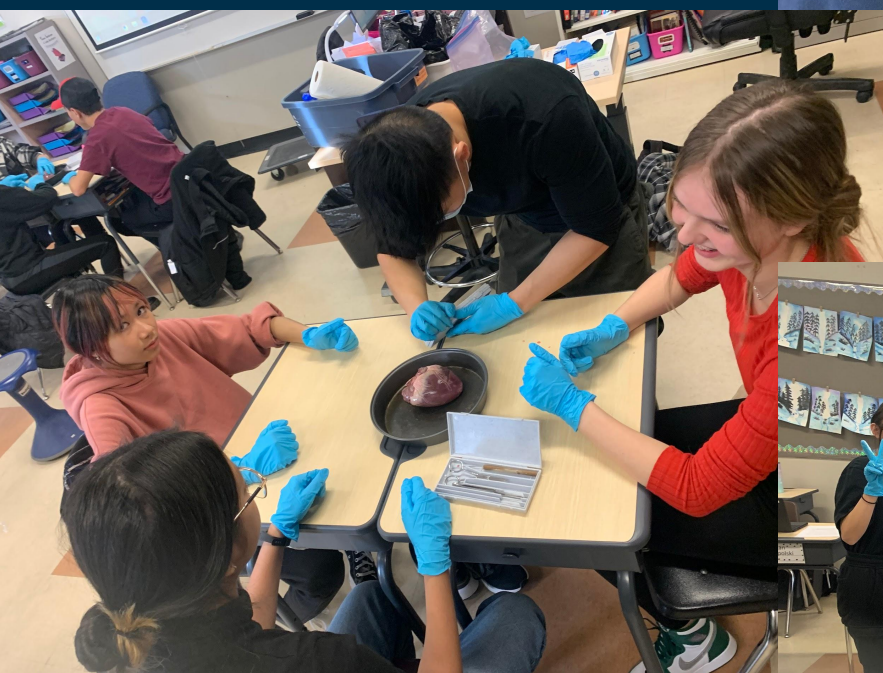


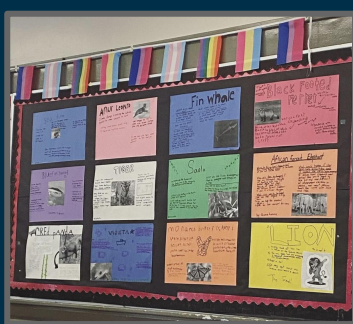
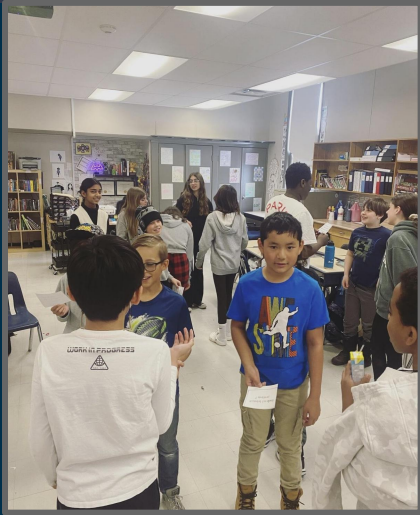
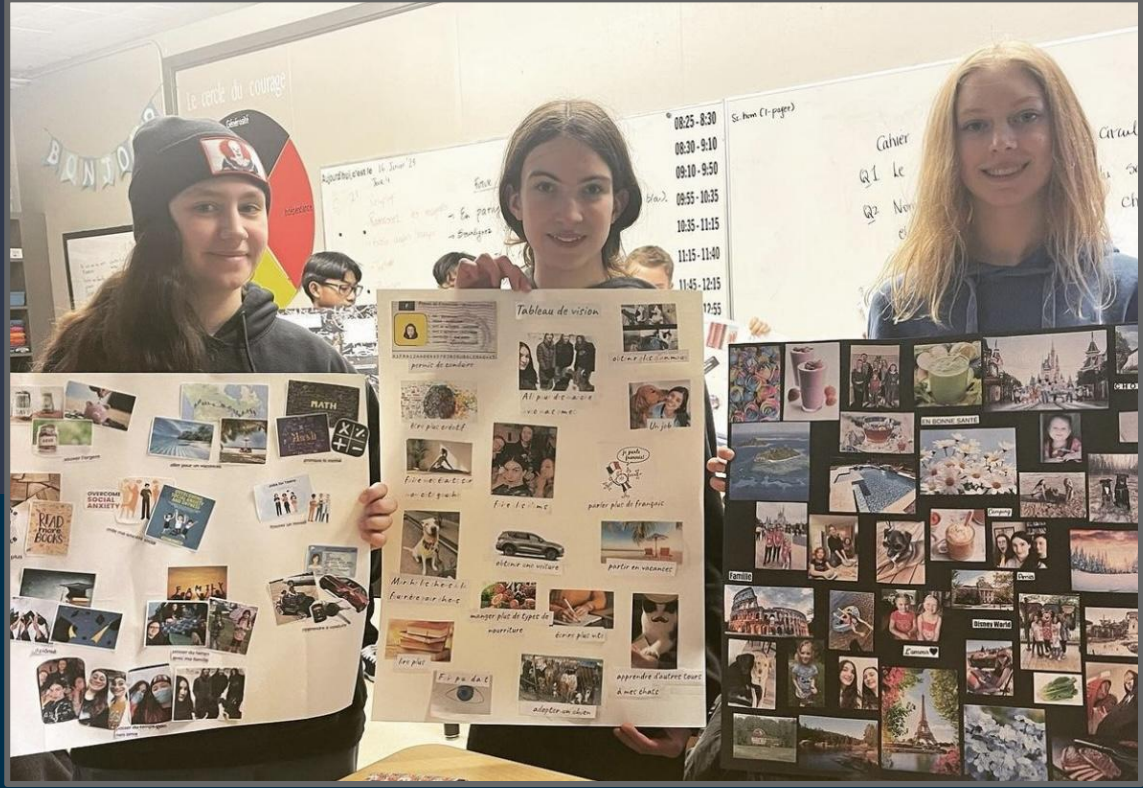
Our Mission

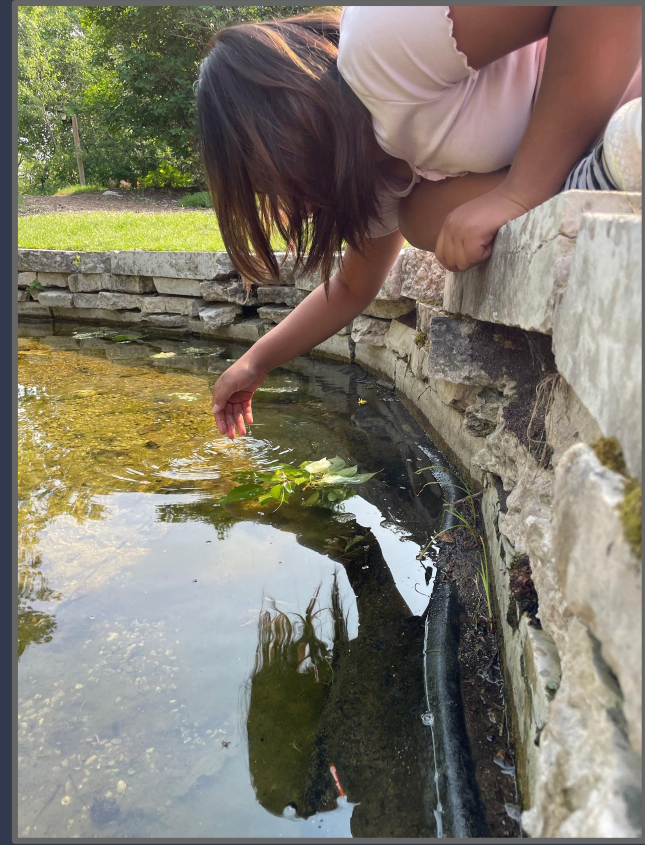
At ÉSOMS... we provide students with opportunities to join multiple different athletic teams and lessons about sportsmanship and community play.

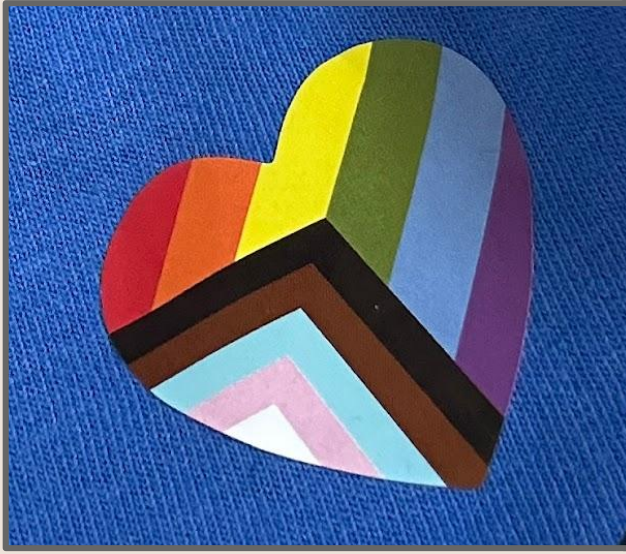


At ÉSOMS... we plan experiences that may spark new interests and hobbies.
