Dear Families,

It has been a busy start to the school year. With many new students and staff at the school, we are working to build our community and routines together.

We were able to complete our Terry Fox Walk on Friday, September 15th. That Friday was a day where it drizzled intermittently. As we concerned ourselves about a bit of drizzle, it makes one consider the weather that Terry ran through, day after day, and what an incredible feat he accomplished by running 5373 kilometers in 143 days. Terry is truly a national hero. West St Paul School fundraised close to one thousand dollars.

We had a fantastic "Welcome Back" evening on Thursday, September 21. Our Parent Advisory Council (PAC) organized an evening of bouncers, face painting, mini-car driving, and tattoos with free pizza and drinks for everyone. We thank our PAC and volunteers for working to make this evening happen! Watch for the PAC Halloween Family Dance coming soon. The next PAC meeting is Wednesday, October 11 at 6:00. Childcare will be provided.

Each year we practice at least ten fire drills and two lockdown drills. We have already had two fire drill practices this year. After one fire drill, we practiced walking to our evacuation site at the West St. Paul Curling Club. We will always walk the west side of the highway to our evacuation site because it is safer than crossing the highway in two places with more than 650 students and staff. The west side of the highway is almost twice as quick as the east side where one needs to cross the highway in two spots. In an emergency, we will always take the safest and fastest route to the evacuation site.

Students in grades 6, 7, and 8 have been working hard on their Peace posters this month. The Lion's International Peace Poster contest is an opportunity for students to creatively express what peace means to them. This year's theme is "Dare to Dream".

Tomorrow, we recognize the National Day for Truth and Reconciliation and encourage everyone to wear an orange shirt. Discussions have been ongoing this week as we honour the children who never returned home and Survivors of residential schools, as well as their families and communities. Our grade 1-5 classes have been learning a song that they will be singing together outside the school tomorrow afternoon at 1:00.

Our Lost and Found Box is overflowing. Please label your child's clothing. Each month we find dozens of pieces of clothing outside, in hallways and other corners of the school. We would love to return the clothing to their owners but there are usually no identifying marks. Three or four times each year we take unclaimed clothing to the Salvation Army.

Our annual Farm to School fundraiser is now open. Vegetable packages are ordered online and will be delivered to the school and available to be picked up during parent teacher conferences November 22-24. See more information in this newsletter.

There is no school for students on Tuesday, October 3rd because of the provincial election. Our students in grades 3 and up have been learning about the election and will do a student vote on Friday and Monday. Monday October 9 is Thanksgiving, and the school will be closed.



Canada Learning Bond Uptake Program

Dear Parents/Guardians:

Did you know your child might be eligible to receive free money for post-secondary education?

The Canada Learning Bond is a federal education savings grant from which eligible children can receive **up to \$2,000 deposited directly into a Registered Education Savings Plan (RESP)**. Receiving this money requires no personal contributions or fees and does not affect any other Government of Canada benefits you are receiving.

A child is eligible for the Canada Learning Bond if:

- They are born January 1st, 2004, or later
- They were a resident of Canada before they turned 15
- They have a Social Insurance Number (SIN)
- Their family makes a low income, or has for even one year before they turned 15

There is a Canada Learning Bond Sign-up event happening near you:

October 13th, 2023 4:00 pm - 7:30 pm Maples Collegiate 1330 Jefferson Ave

At this event, you will have the opportunity to:

- Order a no-cost Manitoba Birth Certificate
- Apply for a **Social Insurance Number (SIN)** for your children
- Apply for a Secure Certificate of Indian Status (SCIS)
- Open an RESP with a provider to apply for the Canada Learning Bond.
