
news from room 5....

The grade 4 students in Mrs. Cross' class have been busy the last three months. They created milk jug totem poles during their study of Canada and the Haida people of British Columbia. During Black History month they learned about Martin Luther King and his speech " I Have A Dream" and created a dream mobile of their hopes for their school and the world. They have been building an igloo since January while learning about the Inuit people of the North. Students have been saving their 41 milk jugs and to date they have recycled 350 milk jugs. They are hoping to complete their Igloo by the end of April. The project has provided the students with lessons in math, science, and social studies.



Science Centers Room 3

Last month the students in room three were learning about forces that repel and attract through science centers. The opportunity for students to participate in inquiry based learning helps provide greater potential for them to learn, and the ability to take risks without the fear of failure. Each group of students tested materials in all five centers multiple times, while also working through a *learning journal where they* could document their experiences. They had a blast learning through hands on, engaging centers, and enjoyed sharing their learning during student led conferences with their parents.

Parent Council Annual General Meeting (AGM) WEDNESDAY, MAY 11th 7:00 p.m.

Nominations are now being accepted for the executive of the Parent Advisory Council (PAC). Election of the 2016-2017 Executive will take place during the AGM.

The duties and responsibilities of the Executive include:

Chair – Shall preside at meetings of the PAC Executive; shall set the agenda in consultation with the school Principal; shall chair meetings of the PAC; shall be ex-officio member(s) of all PAC committees; shall act as authorized signing officer(s) on bank accounts; shall have signing authority on official correspondence; shall coordinate all activities of the PAC executive between regular meetings.

Vice-Chair – Shall assist the Chair and in the absence of the Chair shall chair meetings and supervise the affairs of the PAC. In the event of resignation, incapacity or leave of absence of the Chair shall fulfill those responsibilities.

Secretary – Shall maintain all records pertaining to the PAC and its committees; shall be responsible for any correspondence issued under the direction of the PAC; shall provide copies of meeting minutes within two weeks to all Executive members, and in addition shall provide a copy to the school for distribution to the general public.

Treasurer – Shall keep an account of all financial transactions of the PAC as per School Division guidelines; shall be responsible for banking the PAC's funds and for arranging banking services; shall present a financial report at each meeting of the PAC and an annual financial statement at the Annual General Meeting; shall submit a copy of each financial report to the Principal, who shall retain one copy on file at the school for a five year period.

Committee Chairs – Shall perform duties assigned by the PAC Executive; shall provide regular progress reports to be included in the minutes; shall provide financial reports relevant to the work of the committee. The standing committees shall be:

- Fundraising Committee

Ad-hoc committees will be established by the PAC or the Executive as the need arises.

Infant massage is a daily practice shared by parents and caregivers all over the world looking to bond, communicate and care for their babies in a healthy, natural way. Babies who receive regular massage have been shown to have better quality of sleep, have an improved rate of healthy weight gain. Aside from physical benefits, infant massage has been shown to improve the ability of parents and babies, to bond more closely and communicate with one another. Touch is one of the ways an infant communicates with the world around them. It is the first sense to develop in utero, and the only sense we cannot live without. In essence, learning to share touch with your infant is a powerful, natural way to care for your baby's physical and emotional health.

Massage is a practice that can be shared by all families, regardless of religious, cultural, or socio-economic background.




