





- To provide delegates and support to the organized sports programs and their mandate in Manitoba;
- To promote activities through which funds may be raised to support the activities of the Recreation and Culture Committee for future development and/or growth of such activities in the Municipality;
- To communicate with the residents of the Municipality to determine recreational needs for activities, services and organized sports, and make residents aware of the recreational services, activities and sports programs being offered.
