May arrived with our grade four students attending Science Camp. One class was designing wacky gumball machines while the other class made models of our lungs, practiced some coding and made things to be 3-D printed. Each year, Science Camp gives about 1500 students in the Seven Oaks School Division an opportunity to act as designing and investigative scientists for the whole day.

Two weeks earlier, our grade 5 classes attended a full day at Arts Camp. Groups at Arts Camp took part in a variety of arts programming such as bucket drumming, cartooning, jigging, hip hop and musical theater.

The Seven Oaks School Division is unique in our province. We do things differently by focussing our resources on students and student opportunities. At no additional charge to families, we offer Learn to Skate, Learn to Swim, Science and Arts Camp, field trips and no charge lunch supervision. Middle Years and High School students have no charge band instruments so all students can participate in a musical experience. We save families money by offering school supplies for the entire school year for only thirty-five dollars per child. These are all possibilities offered to parents and students by our school division.

The Manitoba Government is currently carrying out a review of Kindergarten to Grade 12 education in our province. This is an opportunity for all parents to share what they value about Seven Oaks schools. It is rare that the government asks for input from parents and we would urge parents to take the opportunity to share their views. The rest of May will continue to be very busy. Cross country running and track and field, yearbook orders and spring photos, volunteer reception and field trips will add to the learning this month. Arts in the Park 2019 takes place May 29-31. The schools of Seven Oaks take over Kildonan Park to highlight all forms of art all day Wednesday and Thursday and concluding in the afternoon on Friday May 31st. This is the 10th Arts in the Park – another example of how Seven Oaks is unique! More information from individual classes will follow.

PAC ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING

Nominations are now being accepted for the executive of the Parent Advisory Council (PAC). Election of the 2019-2020 Executive will take place during the AGM.

The duties and responsibilities of the Executive shall include:

Chair – shall preside at meetings of the PAC Executive; shall set the agenda in consultation with the school Principal; shall chair meetings of the PAC; shall be ex-officio member(s) of all PAC committees; shall act as authorized signing officer(s) on bank accounts; shall have signing authority on official correspondence; shall coordinate all activities of the PAC executive between regular meetings.

Vice-Chair – Shall assist the Chair and in the absence of the Chair shall chair meetings and supervise the affairs of the PAC. In the event of resignation, incapacity or leave of absence of the Chair shall fulfill those responsibilities.

Secretary – Shall maintain all records pertaining to the PAC and its committees; shall be responsible for any correspondence issued under the direction of the PAC; shall provide copies of meeting minutes within two weeks to all Executive members, and in addition shall provide a copy to the school for distribution to the general public.

Treasurer – Shall keep an account of all financial transactions of the PAC as per School Division guidelines; shall be responsible for banking the PAC's funds and for arranging banking services; shall present a financial report at each meeting of the PAC and an annual financial statement at the Annual General Meeting; shall submit a copy of each financial report to the Principal, who shall retain one copy on file at the school for a five year period.

Committee Chairs – Shall perform duties assigned by the PAC Executive; shall provide regular progress reports to be included in the minutes; shall provide financial reports relevant to the work of the committee. The standing committees shall be:

- Fundraising Committee

Ad-hoc committees will be established by the PAC or the Executive as the need arises.
