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#### **The Changing Face of Our Outdoor Play Space**

As many of you may have noticed the face of the playground is changing! The WSP Parent Council is pleased to be seeing the fruits of their hard labour. They, along with the support of all of the WSP school community, have focused their fundraising efforts to raise the money used to fund the developing multistage project.

Stage one was the construction of a cedar pergola. It covers the  $16 \times 18$  foot concrete pad, which supports seating for up to 24 on metal benches to complete this outdoor classroom area. Already, the pergola is a central gathering spot for students of various ages. Each break they can be seen enjoying themselves chatting and visiting together. We have also been pleased to see members of the WSP community enjoying the outdoors in the evening hours, visiting with friends, on the pergola.

In addition to the 70 trees purchased with the tree drive funds raised last spring, 10 new evergreens, generously donated by Manitoba Conservation and Forestry, now have been strategically planted to start to provide a much needed windbreak. Next in the plans is the involvement of the children more directly by having them plant young cedar and white spruce trees. Staff from Manitoba Conservation & Forestry provided small group instruction on the importance of trees and the ways in which we need to care for them. Students will be encouraged to help with watering prior to the arrival of snow. Stay tuned for continuing updates!



#### **UPDATE FROM THE NATURAL PLAY SPACE COMMITTEE!!**

We are very proud and excited to let everyone know that phase 1 of the West St. Paul Nature Park is now completed! We planted over 100 trees and shrubs to shelter us from the winds that whip through our playground, plus we were able to get 10 White Spruce trees from the Conservation Stewardship of Manitoba ( with about 100 smaller trees being planted with the students from grades K-4 between October 20-22). We were also able to finish the outdoor classroom (Pergola) with bench seating and put sod around the concrete pad.

Our focus is now on Phase 2 and the fundraisers to help make it happen!

QSP packages have gone out to families and our annual Craft Sale is coming up on Sunday, November 15th.

We would like to thank Hilderman's Lawn and Garden for planting the trees in June and continuing to work on the Outdoor Classroom over the summer, and Ryan Klos with the Conservation Stewardship of Manitoba, for the White Spruce trees and the small trees that are going to be planted and cared for by our students and staff.

We will keep everyone up to date, using the bulletin board in the front lobby of the school, a renewed PAC webpage on the school website (we are working on this) and of course with monthly updates in the school newsletter.

We are going to need volunteers in the spring to help with weeding and watering our new nature space. We hope to have both parents and staff as part of a group that could come out about every two weeks or as needed to help out. There will be more information as we get closer to Spring.
