ADMINISTRATORS' MESSAGE

A Place for "Productive Struggle"

In a couple of weeks, you are invited to West St. Paul School to participate in an important event. It will be your child's *celebration of learning* (student led conference), which is the opportunity to share with you accomplishments achieved during the second term. Your child will be confident and excited as s/he describes and articulates her/his learning. You possibly have noted, when the learner attempts tasks s/he successfully can complete unaided s/he often expresses that it was 'easy'.

The key for the teacher becomes creating the climate and environment where the student is engaged, s/he participates in reflective thinking, and has the opportunity to effectively interact and learn from classmates. Learning has been researched and described by psychologists such as Lev Vygotsky, who coined the term zone of proximal development. This is the space just beyond what the student can do independently. The learner finds the task a challenge but not to the degree where it is too difficult. S/he benefits on receiving 'appropriate' guidance and assistance from others. This is where we play a part. We need to be supportive and encouraging. This means we have to allow our youngsters to wrestle, work at solving the problem and experience what John Van de Walle has termed experience a "productive struggle". We, as caregivers, have to resist the urge to be the rescuer and provide the solution too prematurely. Our role becomes one of cheerleader and encourager. We learn to ask strategic questions and make suggestions to guide our child through the thinking process. After all, thinking is vital to all learning.



Mayor and Kaycee Kulbaba friend and future educator! A big thank you to all of you for coming out!




