ADMINISTRATORS' MESSAGE

Italy Comes to West St Paul

What a delight for those instructors inspired by the philosophy of Reggio Emilia to have had the opportunity to meet an actual *pedagogista*! The afternoon of Monday, April 20, 2015, we were pleased to welcome Tizianna Filippini, an Italian visitor from the northern municipality of Reggio Emilia, world renowned for its progressive view of children.

Loris Malaguzzi is recognized as one of the founding fathers of this innovative pedagogical approach, where the image of the child is central to the belief. Children are regarded as inquisitive, capable and contributing members who play an instrumental role in their own learning. In this setting, teachers become astute observers who carefully document interactions between children, as they are encouraged to pose their own questions and pursue their own inquiries. Emphasis is placed on the process rather than product.

Many Seven Oaks teachers have had opportunities, during the last ten years to research, investigate and implement various threads from this perspective into their teaching practice. Having the chance to dialogue and engage in educational discourse with a person with such a background was an educator's dream come true!

Likewise, Tizianna was here on a research mission of her own. She wanted to observe how the tenets of Reggio Emilia have been integrated into our Early Years classrooms. She was surprised and quite impressed with our attempts to embrace the ideals of what is close and dear to her. She will return to Italy buoyed with the determination to convey what she has learned about us and the success of our shared vision about the importance of childhood.

FROM THE OFFICE...

Transportation applications for the 2015-2016 school year are now due. Please submit your applications to the office as soon as possible.

Should your child be away from school for any reason, please contact the office. The answering machine is available 24 hours per day. Please leave a message with your child's full name, classroom teacher's name and the reason for the absence. We ask that you leave a voice message on the main switchboard as some days the teacher may be away, or be too busy with a class, to check their email or voicemail before attendance is taken. We thank you for your cooperation.

All visitors are asked to sign in at the office upon entering the school. This includes all parents. For the safety of our children and all guest, we need to keep a record of everyone who enters and exits the building. Children leaving the school due to illness or for appointments must be signed out at the office by a parent or guardian.



Sources of Strength is a proactive mental health program that we began running in our school this past year. The **Sources of Strength** program promotes positive mental health practices by building protective factors into a community by strengthening the youth-adult connectedness in a building and through the teaching of resiliency and coping strategies. The program is facilitated by adult mentors working alongside a group of middle school peer leaders to spread messages of Hope, Help and Strength throughout the school building. The group's first project involved a school wide campaign that had peer leaders visiting classrooms to talk about the importance of having a trusted adult you can go to during difficult times. Every child from k-grade 8 identified a caring, trusted adult in our building they could go to for help. Some other projects that leaders are currently working on are the creation of a visual display to highlight who the trusted adults are at West St. Paul as well as a video describing **Sources of Strength** to be shared at a school assembly.

Nominations are now being accepted for the executive of the Parent Advisory Council (PAC). Election of the 2015-2016 Executive will take place during the AGM.

The duties and responsibilities of the Executive shall include:

Chair – shall preside at meetings of the PAC Executive; shall set the agenda in consultation with the school Principal; shall chair meetings of the PAC; shall be ex-officio member(s) of all PAC committees; shall act as authorized signing officer(s) on bank accounts; shall have signing authority on official correspondence; shall coordinate all activities of the PAC executive between regular meetings.

Vice-Chair – Shall assist the Chair and in the absence of the Chair shall chair meetings and supervise the affairs of the PAC. In the event of resignation, incapacity or leave of absence of the Chair shall fulfill those responsibilities.

Secretary – Shall maintain all records pertaining to the PAC and its committees; shall be responsible for any correspondence issued under the direction of the PAC; shall provide copies of meeting minutes within two weeks to all Executive members, and in addition shall provide a copy to the school for distribution to the general public.

Treasurer – Shall keep an account of all financial transactions of the PAC as per School Division guidelines; shall be responsible for banking the PAC's funds and for arranging banking services; shall present a financial report at each meeting of the PAC and an annual financial statement at the Annual General Meeting; shall submit a copy of each financial report to the Principal, who shall retain one copy on file at the school for a five year period.
