FRIENDLY REMINDERS





We ask that parents call in student absences at anytime, as the school has 24-hour voicemail. The school phone number is 204-339-1964. An advance note to the classroom teacher <u>and</u> office is appreciated when extended absences will occur. We have great concern for the safety of your children. Advance calls regarding absences allow us to focus more quickly on students who are unaccounted for each morning, due to either missed busses or morning delays. Also, please call if your child will be late for any reason. Thank you for your cooperation.



Students are able to make phone calls with a permission note from their teacher during class time or during breaks. Cell phones should not be used for telephone calls or texting during school hours (8:00 a.m.-2:30 p.m.) Please be aware that students may not take photos of others on personal phones (or cameras) in the school, on the playground or on the buses.

The policy for lice is outlined by the WRHA, which is included in this newsletter. At WSP we will: inform both by letter and in person the family affected with lice including the procedures required before their child may return to school. Shampooing must take place before returning and daily lice checks at home must occur until all nits are eliminated. Lice is considered a nuisance issue not a disease by the WRHA but we realize that it is a major inconvenience for families. We will do our best to follow up with those children upon their return as an additional proactive measure. Teachers also will speak with their children reminding them not to share combs or items of clothing.



When picking up or dropping off students during the school day, please be courteous and use parking stalls in Visitor's Parking on the south-side of the parking lot facing the playground. Parking in front, facing the school, is not permitted as that area is <u>reserved for school busses and service vehicles</u>. We


thank you for your consideration.


Terry Fox Walk


