Our Beliefs: Take care of yourself. Take care of each other. Take care of this place.

Every day there is a news article about bullying, Bill 18 or human rights violations. These news articles, radio reports and TV segments provide students and staff with a lot of material for discussion in classrooms about what bullying is, how they can stop it, how it affects them and what all those things feel like. It is something we talk about every single day at school.

We use our school beliefs as a constant reminder to children in how to treat each other. Was the way you spoke to your friend a way to take care of them? Does pushing and shoving show that you are taking care of another student? How do you present yourself and solve a problem or conflict with someone? In addition to those ways of talking, we are participating in a study from the University of North Dakota about cyber-bullying. (middle years students). This study asks students to think about their own on-line behaviour and others they know, how they interact with their technology and give them strategies and things to think about as they text, are on Facebook and on the Internet.

We have many, many books in our classrooms and our libraries that support students learning about bully behaviour, either theirs, or others. We have recently added twenty five new titles to our Library that are for students, teachers and families to understand and respond appropriately to this issue. These books were purchased with funds given to us for Teacher Appreciation Week by the Seven Oaks School Division. The theme of these books is building Safe and Caring Schools. We all want every child to feel safe and secure when they are at school. We work hard at that every day.

This coming Wednesday, April 10, students and staff of West St. Paul School will be participating in the Canadian Red Cross Day of Pink. This is an initiative that provides students, staff and the larger community with the opportunity to discuss the impact of bullying and to learn how they can use their power to help create a safe and respectful school environment. Students, staff and community members are encouraged to wear pink shirts in solidarity to show that they are taking a stand against bullying.

The Day of Pink started in 2007 when two high school students in Nova Scotia took a stand against bullying in their school. The students asked all of their peers to wear pink to school after they heard a male classmate had been bullied for wearing a pink shirt. To continue the momentum, the Canadian Red Cross Day of Pink campaign brings together schools and communities to wear the shirt and stand together against bullying.

Let's continue to work at making our school and community a safe place for all. On Wednesday, show your support by wearing PINK!


