KINDERGARTEN NEWS REGISTRATION

Kindergarten Registration for West St. Paul School will officially begin on Monday, February 25, 2013.

In order to accommodate families who cannot register during the school day, we will be extending registration hours on the first day of registration (February 25th) from 9:00 a.m. until 5:00 p.m. Please do not arrive at the school any sooner than 8:30 a.m. due to the large volume of busses dropping off students in the morning. Parents registering their children for kindergarten should park between the frost fence and the gymnasium wall. The gymnasium is located on the south side of the building.

Registration will take place in our newly renovated front fover.

All children that are registering for <u>Kindergarten must be 5 years old by December 31st, 2013 (born in 2008) in order to begin school starting in September 2013. Please bring your child's birth certificate and current Manitoba Medical Card with you when registering your child. Proof of address may be required.</u>



Educational Assistant Internship Program

This program trains unemployed or underemployed persons to work as an educational assistant within the school system.

Excellent candidates for this program are school volunteers, lunch supervisors, substitute educational assistants, foreign trained teachers, and parents of special needs children. Candidates ideally should already be volunteering in schools and would be recommended by their principal. Candidates need to be caring and reliable.

Trainees attend workshops every Monday at Jobworks. The rest of the week is spent doing a practicum in a public school. If required, some students spend part of the week upgrading English, Math and Computer skills in order to complete a Grade 12 Diploma. The program runs from September to March each year. Interviews for September are held in April and May. This program is funded by the Department of Entrepreneurship, Training and Trade/Employment and Training Partnerships and the Manitoba Metis Federation.

Eligibility

- Employment Insurance (EI) recipient or an EI claim within the previous 3 years;
- Parental/maternity claim within the previous 5 years;
- Employment and Income Assistance recipient;
- Unemployed or underemployed individual

You must attend an information and orientation meeting. Application forms will only be available at these meetings. Information meetings will be held:
