D.A.R.E. In Room 9

D.A.R.E stands for Drug and Alcohol Resistance Education. It's a program aimed at helping Grade 5 and 6 students think about the negative effects of drugs and alcohol. It teaches kids ways to help them make healthy choices through using a model for making good decisions around the use and abuse of drugs and alcohol. The model teaches us to first define our problem, (for example a friend offering us a cigarette), assess our choices, respond to the problem and then evaluate our decision, D.A.R.E. The program was taught by Constables Stanke and Kecuba from the Selkirk R.C.M.P. office. This was a 10



week program that taught us about the dangers of drugs and alcohol and the messages behind tobacco and alcohol advertising campaigns that target to target young people.

We learned many things in the D.A.R.E program. We learned about peer pressure and self pressure. Peer pressure is when a friend tells you to do something that you don't want to do or

that might get you in trouble, make you sick or hurt. Self pressure is when you know something isn't good for you and even though no one is pressuring you, you're curiosity gets the best of you and you try it even if you know you shouldn't.

We have learned a lot and what we have learned will help us in the future if we ever come across any of these situations.

West St. Paul students and staff would like to once again say a huge THANK YOU to all our volunteers!.






