On behalf of Seven Oaks School Division and the Strong North, Strong Winnipeg Coalition, we want to thank you for your support of the Chief Peguis Trail Extension West. It's important for the community to rally together and show our city what this project could mean for community growth.

Though we've anticipated an extension from Main St. to Brookside Blvd. since the completion of Phase 1 six years ago, this project is not a certainty. Planners have finalized design concepts and City Council will soon vote on which infrastructure projects will receive funding in 2018, but other projects could take priority.

Local councillors and representatives from both provincial and federal government are in favour of this project and we hope that by mobilizing our community and the city to support this infrastructure development we can influence Council as a whole to vote for this project. By voicing the importance of this project for our area and for Winnipeg, we have the opportunity to shape our community together.

About the Chief Peguis Trail Extension Project

Seven Oaks School Division is committed to enhancing not only the quality of education for its community, but also the economic, social and physiological health and continued growth of the community. The Chief Peguis Trail Extension West would increase the commercial tax base, which will increase provincial education funding and help put North Winnipeg on par, developmentally-speaking, with other areas of the city. This means the likelihood of better facilities in our area for community members.

This project should have been a priority following the completion of the Waverley underpass, but it is not a done deal. The project requires public support if it is to be selected for funding by City Council and move forward in 2018.

Completing the Chief Peguis Trail will:

- Help increase accessibility into and out of our neighbourhoods
- Divert traffic from existing routes and spread flow over more arteries
- Allow more opportunities for retail and commercial development
- Increase residential development
- Increase the commercial tax base, which will increase provincial education funding

The Chief Peguis Trail Extension West would be invaluable not only for North Winnipeg – but for the city as a whole, supporting economic development and creating recreational opportunities. The completion of this roadway would further accommodate traffic flow, relieve traffic on neighbourhood streets and provide connections to surrounding areas.

Seven Oaks School Division is working with area councillors, infrastructure and industry stakeholders and community members to ensure City Council as a whole recognizes the importance of completing Chief Peguis Trail.

A strong North End means a strong city. And a strong city needs this expansion.
