## Chairperson's Message

Our current board of trustees was elected to a four-year term in 2018. What a four years it's been. Budget cuts. Covid. Bill 64. We've had our challenges.

Looking back on our term, I'm grateful. We've navigated the challenges of Covid, kept our students and staff safe, and supported student learning and well-being in every way imaginable. For this, we are grateful to our staff for their dedication, creativity and perseverance. We are impressed by the resourcefulness and resilience our students displayed throughout. And we are especially grateful for our parents and guardians in adhering to health protocols, supporting their children's learning and adjusting to the all too frequent changes forced upon us by Covid.

Our funding has not kept pace with costs. Every budget our board has been faced with difficult choices. We've managed to maintain most of our programs, reasonable class sizes and continued to limit costs to our families for things like field trips and musical instruments. We've even found additional resources to support settlement services and summer programs.

When the provincial government threatened local decision-making in education with Bill 64, our board and our community rallied to "Keep Seven Oaks, Seven Oaks." Thanks to everyone who put up a lawn sign, phoned their MLA or signed a petition.

They backed down! We won! Seven Oaks will stay Seven Oaks.


We did more than navigate Covid, budget cuts and Bill 64. We moved forward on a number of important initiatives. We completed construction and opened our 26th school, École Templeton, and a new MET School program in Winnipeg's Exchange District. We expanded Cooperative Vocational programming. We initiated and passed a comprehensive anti-racism policy. We've obtained sites for new schools to serve our growing community. We have started design on the first of these schools located in Aurora at North Point. It will be a K-8 dual track school and should open in fall 2025.

We also adopted a new ward structure for this fall's municipal election that aligns the Riverbend/Rivergrove community with West Kildonan and Garden City. We've been busy and we've accomplished a lot. We were pleased to support the very successful community effort to keep the West Kildonan Library open.

It was a joy to participate in this year's high school grads again and we are really excited about the school year to come. Thanks to our staff for their dedication and to our community for their support. It has been our privilege to serve as your trustees.

# We're excited to get back to class



We're eager to get back to class and give our students the rich learning opportunities they deserve, learning opportunities that embrace our three "R's": Relationships, Relevance, and Rigour.

Our schools are organized to support strong relationships. Teachers in early and middle grades often stay with their students for a couple of years. Every high school student has a teacher advisor who is a constant mentor throughout their senior years. Each and every student gets the care and understanding they deserve because they are known.





Whether it's the book that is chosen for a beginning reader or the project designed for a graduating student, our teachers work to ensure that learning is relevant to their students. Hands-on experiences, getting outdoors or connecting with a mentor make learning come alive. And when students are interested in what they learn, they learn more.

There's rigour too. Seven Oaks students' achievement is routinely above provincial standards. Our graduation rate is consistently high. Seven out of ten Seven Oaks grads go directly on to receive post-secondary education. Our renewed focus on literacy and numeracy ensures that each and every student succeeds.

Every middle years student participates in our 'Learn to Bike' program. Every grade one and two student 'Learns to Skate' and every grade four student 'Learns to Swim.'





# We're excited about Truth and Reconciliation





We're more committed than ever to do our part to further truth and reconciliation. We want all of our students to understand the contribution of Indigenous peoples to our country, to understand the devastating impact of colonization and residential schools and understand our treaty obligations. To these ends, we will continue to ensure that our schools teach about treaties and residential schools. We will continue to learn from the teachings of our Elders and do our part to help preserve and revitalize Indigenous languages.

We offer an Ojibway Bilingual program at Riverbend and Edmund Partridge. Almost all of our schools have after school Pow Wow clubs. And we celebrate Indigenous culture and the success of our students with a huge feast and Pow Wow.



# We're excited to look to the future









A twelve classroom addition to West Kildonan Collegiate is under construction and will be completed this year. It includes two new science labs, a 2000 sq. ft. fitness facility and improved space for arts programs.


Our Cooperative Vocational (CVE)

 We are planning to construct three new K-8 schools to serve the new communities of Aurora at North Point, Highland Pointe and Meadowlands. We have started design on the first of these schools located in Aurora at North Point. It will be a K-8 dual track school and should open in fall 2025.

We're continuing to initiate innovative programming to ensure that our students have the best possible opportunities.
 Our "Tech Hub" program provides high school students with instruction in video game design from industry experts. Our downtown MET School campus provides unique opportunities for internships in technology and the arts. Elwick Community School's Sistema program provides students with incredible musical instruction from Winnipeg Symphony Orchestra musicians.





We're continuing to develop our unique land-based learning centre, the Aki Centre, in West St. Paul where students learn how an Indigenous worldview can help us meet our obligation to be stewards of our environment.
