
Can I go back to school?

In Manitoba, adults 19 or older can return to school. You can go to a literacy program for:

- · Reading
- Writing
- Spelling
- · Math

You can go to a learning centre for:

- · Mature High School Diploma
- · GED (General Educational Development)
- Upgrade high school credits to enter a trade, college or university



Why would I return to school?

Everyone has their own reasons for going back to school. You can start at the level that is best for you.

Some people go back to gain knowledge, for the job they have right now or to get the job they want to have.

Some people may go back to help out with daily life tasks such as filling out forms, understanding instructions or helping their children with school work.



When do I start classes?

Some classes start at any time and some have start times in September or January.

They are offered in the morning, afternoon or at night.

Online classes may be offered if these times don't work for you.



How much does it cost?

Classes are tuition free, there may be a one-time registration fee of about \$50.


Because many places offer classes each one is different.

Are there any classes in my area?



Others will go back to upgrade some high school credits so they can enter a training program, trade, college or university.

You can talk with the school you choose about classes you have taken. This will help you and the school know where to begin.


Can I go part time or full time?
