


École Constable Edward Finney School Newsletter November 2023

Hearing Screening

Dear Parents/Guardians,

As part of a hearing conservation program, Seven Oaks School Division is conducting hearing screenings again this year. This is being done to identify those pupils who may have a hearing problem that needs attention.

All Kindergarten and Grade 1 students will be screened unless parents notify the school that they do not want their children to take part in this program; any new students to our school will be screened as well. Students from Grades 2 to 5 will only be screened at the request of his/her parents/guardians by calling the school 204-694-8688 or emailing me directly at annie.oule@7oaks.org. Our screening session will be held from November 13—November 17.

If you do not hear from us, you may assume that your child's hearing is within the normal limits; however, if further testing is indicated, you will be informed by letter.

3. Keep an emergency kit in your vehicle!

Prepare an emergency kit and keep it in your vehicle. Refresh the supplies for winter. For example, add an extra blanket or new food items.

4. Check weather reports

When severe winter weather threatens, Environment Canada issues special alerts to notify Canadians in affected areas so that they can take steps to protect themselves and their property.

What is the CLB?

The Canada Learning Bond (CLB) is money the Government of Canada will add to a Registered Education Savings Account (RESP) to help pay for studies after high school. It's completely free and you do not need to add any money to receive the CLB.

How much \$ is available?

Eligible children can receive \$500 - \$2,000 deposited directly into their RESP.

Who is eligible?

Children who:

- were born after January 1, 2004 or later.
- are residents of Canada.
- have a Birth Certificate and Social Insurance Number (SIN).

We can help you get a free Birth Certificate, Social Insurance Number (SIN) and choose an RESP Provider.
