<p>Université de Saint-Boniface Entrance Scholarships</p>	<p>Eligibility for this scholarship is based on the following criteria:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Canadian citizen or permanent resident; • Diploma from a Canadian high school; • Minimum cumulative GPA of 80% at the end of Grade 12. This average is calculated based on the results in Francais 40S and Mathematics 40S (Pre-calculus 40S, Applied Mathematics 40S or Consumer Mathematics 40S) and in an additional 40S-level course in which the student received his or her highest mark; • Application for admission submitted to USB before March 1st; • Registration as a full-time student in a university program (18 credits minimum) or part-time in a college program (60% course load), upon graduating from Grade 12 or one year after having graduated from high school.
