Grade 4 and 5 Student Vote

On October 23, the students from the grade 4/5 and grade 5 classrooms participated in the Student Vote at Margaret Park School. All the classrooms had discussions and



learned about each of the candidates prior to them voting, which helped them to decide who the best candidate was. On the day of the vote, students went to their voting station, which was located in room 9. The students of room 9 filled various positions such a voting officers, assistant voting officers and scrutineers, to help direct the voters as to what do and where to go. They also ensured the fairness and legitimacy of the vote. The results were given to the Student Vote program and added to the total for all the schools participating in the city. Students were very respectful of the voting process and were excited to have the opportunity to understand what they will do when they are able to vote at 18 years old.










Patrol News
