




Safety Patrols in Action

Just over 30 patrols have been trained to help the students at Margaret Park arrive and depart our school safely. There are three different kinds of patrols. Bus Patrols ride the school bus and help the bus drivers keep things orderly and safe. Kindergarten patrols help our youngest students arrive and depart the school daily. Street patrols can be seen at the crosswalk on Salter helping direct pedestrians safely through traffic. All patrols wear a bright yellow vest when doing their job so that they can be easily identified.

For the first term you will see Rylan outside as our Patrol Captain. The street patrols on post with him this term are Nevaeh, Perla, Payton, and Richenda. These patrols are trained to be cautious and make decisions that keep our school community safe. We ask that you help them do their job well by respecting their decisions and instructions, whether you're in your car, on a bike, or walking.


Ms. Lagace Update



Letter from the Honourable Kelvin Goertzen

Dear Parents/Guardians and Families,

As you may be aware the Federal government has passed the Cannabis Act, which will come into force on **October 17, 2018**. In Manitoba, possession and use of non-medicinal cannabis will be legal for adults **19** years of age and older.


There are a number of key cannabis facts that young people and parents should understand. It is generally accepted by the medical community that young people are more likely to experience harm from regular use of cannabis before the age of 25. Cannabis can also affect important aspects of a young person's learning and memory. In addition, cannabis use may also lead to addiction, which can have a negative effect on mental health, relationships with others, academics, extra-curricular activities, and everyday life.

Manitoba Education and Training wants to ensure that parents have the tools to talk to their children about cannabis use and its potential consequences. This past April, the Department of Health, Seniors and Active Living and Department of Education and Training helped distribute Addictions Foundation of Manitoba's cannabis awareness package to all school divisions in the province. This package contains numerous fact sheets and infographics on cannabis and a Cannabis Talk Kit for teachers and parents.
