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March has been another busy month at R.F. Morrison School. We were pleased to see so many parents, grandparents and guardians come to school to participate in student-parent-teacher conferences. Your children are always so proud to share their work with you and to be able to demonstrate their growth in so many areas. We know that children are more successful as learners when home and school work together! Hopefully you were able to enjoy the beautiful art work in the hallways created by your children. We were also pleased to offer the Scholastic Book Fair to families during conference time. Children were able to select some great books and our library will benefit by adding some more books as well.

This month, every class has been involved in sessions with the Environmental Speakers Bureau, where children are learning about our environment and keeping our planet green. Grade 5 students met with the band instructors from H. C. Avery to try out a variety of instruments for next year's band class. Students in the EUBP worked on a quilt project sponsored by the Manitoba Arts Council and MPUE to commemorate the 200th anniversary of the birth of Taras Shevchenko. Patrols went bowling. Rooms 9 and 11 attended a performance of Pippi Longstocking at the Gas Station Theatre, and all students in Grades 4 – 6 attended a performance by the Winnipeg Symphony Orchestra. On the 26th we celebrated "Wear Purple" day for Epilepsy awareness. Staff and students wore purple shirts, shoes or sweaters and learned about epilepsy and what it means to create awareness about an issue. All classes are busy preparing for our spring musical taking place in April. There's lots of "clowning around" going on! The annual chocolate fundraiser is now underway. Profits from this fundraiser will go toward camp expenses for our students in Grades 4 – 6, and toward special classroom activities and supplies for Grades K – 3. Grade 4 – 6 camp will offer daily activities for a week in June, from the 16th to the 20th. Stay tuned for more details.

We would like to acknowledge the financial contributions made to academic programming at RF Morrison by the **St. Boniface Ukrainian Foundation** and **Carpathia Credit Union**. Some of those funds are used to purchase supplies for writing Pysanky/Ukrainian Easter eggs, which all of our students will be participating in in April.

In March the Government of Manitoba announced a 3 classroom addition for RF Morrison to address the class size initiative. We are excited about the opportunity to watch our school community grow!

On March 9th Ukrainians around the world celebrated the 200th anniversary of the birth of Taras Shevchenko.



Taras Shevchenko 1814-1861 Ukrainian poet, artist and thinker.

Students from all 12 E.U.B.P. schools in Manitoba were involved in a fabric art project to commemorate the anniversary. Students in our school worked with visiting artist *Natasha Halayda*.

First we read, looked at the art, and talked about the life of Taras Shevchenko.

We looked at pictures from Ukraine and made a pencil drawing on paper.

Next, we transferred pictures onto the painting fabric, and outlined them with permanent black markers.

Later, we used special fabric dyes to fill in our drawings.

Finally, we signed our paintings, took pictures, and admired our masterpieces that will be sewn into quilts which will travel to various destinations and exhibits in Manitoba.

All children performing in the musical production are asked to create their own clown costume! Anything goes! There are many types of clowns! Use lots of colour, and use what is available and already made. Aside from the typical clown costume, some suggestions are:

*big floppy shirts with baggy pants *bright colours and lots of colour *big glasses, goofy glasses *patterns, stripes, polka dots

*oversized jackets *oversized clothing *wide or long ties

*goofy, fun hats *floppy hats *overalls *unusual colour and pattern combinations



*wacky hair, spiky hair, high pigtails or lots of pigtails *big bows or gift bows in girl's hair or as bow ties for boys

*clowns of different character: fairy, princess, fire fighter, police, animal, Disney character, etc.

At Dollarama stores, you can get any of the following: *multicoloured wigs *goofy glasses *pigtail headbands *noodle headbands At Party Stuff (on Milt Stegall Drive/Regent Avenue/Kenaston) *clown noses (\$1.49-\$2.99) *wigs (wide range of prices) Also, check out Value Village.

For make-up, children can come to the production with rosy cheeks, red noses, big red lips, etc.

Children are asked to come to their classroom dressed as clowns by 6:45 p.m. for each 7:00 p.m. show. The leading characters in Grades 4, 5 or 6 should dress appropriately for the Dress Rehearsal which takes place in the same afternoon as the evening show. There will be a silver collection at the door with proceeds going to The Canadian Museum for Human Rights.

Everyone is asked to refrain from parking along the building in the lot. All staff members will be involved in providing assistance during the production; therefore staff will need to use their parking spots during these times. Thank you for your cooperation.
