Did You Know?

- The program offers a balance of English and Ukrainian instruction, allowing each student to gain a rich understanding of the language, traditions and heritage.
- You don't have to speak Ukrainian at home to enrol your child in the program.
- The English–Ukrainian Bilingual Program has been ongoing in Seven Oaks School Division for over 25 years.
- Children coming from other countries find R. F. Morrison a welcoming place to learn English and make new friends.
- There is no additional cost to enrol in the program.
- Students in the program also participate in additional activities such as Ukrainian dancing and multi-school field trips.
- Bussing to the school is provided, based on distance for Seven Oaks School Division students. Students outside Seven Oaks area are welcome although bussing is not available.
- Kindergarten Registration begins February 24th, 2014 for students born in 2009.
- Required for registration, proof of birthdate. Please bring along Birth Certificate and or Manitoba Medical Card.

Kim – "We recorded what we did so we didn't do the same thing twice."




