
#### **Microbiology Workshop**

On Wednesday March 23 we had a guest speaker come from Let's Talk Science to do a microbiology workshop with the students in Sherri's class.


We started by learning how to use a micropipette and how small a microgram ( $\mu$ g) really is! The students had the opportunity to load samples in an agarose gel and watch it run in the gel electrophoresis machine. While this was happening we learned about DNA including the different base pairs. We discussed how DNA replicates naturally and how the process can be sped up using polymerase chain reaction (PCR).

We concluded the activity by looking at some real life examples of how this sort of technology is used to solve crimes.













#### Mrs. Chrunyk - Room 24
