If you do not have access to a computer, you will need to contact the classroom teacher to request a print copy. This will be done on a first-come, first-served basis. Again, if you do not have access to a computer, you can call the classroom teacher to make an appointment.

#### Instructions for Logging on to Parent Connect:

- Go to the École Seven Oaks Middle School website and scroll down to the bottom right side of the page. Click on the *Parent Connect via Email* link.
- Enter your email address and password. If you have forgotten your password or if this is your first time logging on to Parent Connect, click on *"FORGOT MY PASSWORD"*. You will be prompted to enter your email address. Be sure you use the email address that you gave to the school; both email addresses must match.
- The system will then send you a temporary password to the email address you have on file at the school. Please note this is a temporary password and it should be changed as soon as possible. PLEASE DO NOT GIVE PASSWORDS TO STUDENTS.

#### Instructions for Booking your parent/student/teacher conference time

- On the top tool bar click the **<Intrvw>** tab.
- Select your child's homeroom teacher.
- Click on "Select" to choose your appointment time.
- The screen on the right shows you the summary of your appointments.
- To make an appointment with any other teacher, remove the check from the "limit to who teaches this student" and then select the teacher whom you wish to see (ie, phys ed, music, resource, guidance etc.)
- Use the **<Print>** button to get a reader-friendly copy of the schedule.




# **!!! David Robertson inspires kids to read and write!!!**

#### **Physical Education Classes**



# **SCIENCE CLASS**

Here at ESOMS we have been doing a lot of hands on science! Here is a sampling of what we have been doing

Mme. Friesen and Mr. Serzu's class have been learning about electricity including making circuits, discovering magnetic properties, creating enviro batteries, as well as doing some experiments about static electricity including using the Van der Graff generator.

Mme. Desloges' class have been learning about flight and built some balsa wood gliders as well as learning about the difference between airplane and rocket propulsion methods.

Mme. Pancotto's class have been studying the moon including doing some experiments about moon crates and the phases of the moon.





The grade 7 classes have been working hard on their spaghetti bridges.

Ms. Sampson's class has been doing experiments about photosynthesis and cellular respiration.

Ms. Cervantes and Sherri's class have been learning about cells and body systems by doing a gummy bear osmosis lab, building cell models, doing experiments to see exercises affect on heart rate experiments, growing bacteria on agar plates and extracting strawberry DNA.

Mr. Hall's class has been learning about optics doing experiments on reflections and refraction, types of light, lenses and mirrors.

Finally, a number of classes took the time to have fun some and learned about the properties of dry ice such as how it changes states going directly from a solid to a gas, how heavy it is compared to the air around us and how we are able to capture the carbon dioxide in a bubble.

# **Spaghetti Bridge Competition**

For the past month the grade 7 classes here at ESOMS have been applying their knowledge of forces and structure to complete their spaghetti bridges. The groups worked in teams of 3-4. They started by learning about the different types of bridges and trusses and then they designed one that could be made out of only spaghetti and white glue.

The students worked through the design process of identifying the requirements, creating a plan, making modifications, testing and then consolidating their knowledge in a final presentation. Through the process all of the students learned a lot about teamwork and perseverance.

On March 4<sup>th</sup> we went to Kildonan Place Mall to test the bridges. Some quickly crumbled while others managed to withstand a significant amount of pressure. A great time and lot of learning was had by all that participated!












# Mrs. Chrunyk – Room 24










### Miss Koshelanyk – Room 29
