Dear parents and guardians

IS READING A STRUGGLE FOR YOUR CHILD? WE CAN HELP!

CHILDREN'S LITERACY TUTORING PROGRAMS

WHAT IT IS:

The LDA Manitoba provides a literacy tutoring program for children aged 6 – 11 who are experiencing academic difficulties in school due to a determined or suspected learning disability. The program is designed to provide one-to-one tutoring to help improve reading, writing, spelling and comprehension as well as to heighten the child's academic confidence. Social skills will be addressed based on the needs of the child.

HOW IT WORKS:

The program provides each child with: a trained literacy instructor, individualized lesson plans and a place to meet peers with similar needs. Parents are also involved through training sessions as well as the opportunity to observe and learn strategies they can use at home.

COST:

The cost of the entire 9 or 10-week program (dependent on which program is recommended) is currently \$150.00.




