Dear Victory Families,
The month of June is one of the busiest months of the school year, as teachers take advantage of sunny skies and warmer weather to bring students outdoors as much as possible. So far we have had a lot of rain, but we are hoping this changes in the days to come! This year we can resume many activities that we had to cancel in previous years, such as our whole-school field trip, "Victory at Play" - a schoolwide event where all children spend the day outdoors engaged in games and play, and a farewell celebration for our Grade 5 students as they move onto Middle Years.

BEEP Camp is free to Victory school students and includes a snack, fun activities, art, music, sports instruction, and outdoor learning. Children need to come prepared for outdoor learning every day (sunscreen, hat, jacket, rain gear, bug spray, etc.).

Manitoba Health cards will not be accepted.
When registering on-line, it will be helpful to have ready copies/photos of these required documents on the device or computer you will be using at the time of registration. During registration, there will be sections for you to upload the documents into your registration form.
