
We also want to mention our appreciation of the parent volunteers who came out to cook and serve pancakes to our Patrols, as a thank you to our dedicated patrol team.

This month we have been doing an in-depth look at government and leadership here in Canada, Manitoba, and Winnipeg. We learned about the leaders of our federal, provincial, and municipal governments and what those jobs entail. Our class studied the provincial legislatures of Canada which we researched and subsequently made detailed illustrations of. On February 12th, our class, along with Ms. Wakula's class, went on a field trip to the Manitoba Legislative building. This gave us the chance to learn more about our provincial government and the building it works out of. Highlights of our tour included the main entranceway, where we met the two bison statues Mani and Toba, and the Chandelier Room where we saw portraits of King George V and his daughter, Queen Elizabeth II. We were also shown the Chamber, where all of our MLAs sit, and the Rotunda, which features a star on the floor of the room below, that seems to move as you walk around it.


