- Heritage Language classes began




Please note that our school Remembrance Day assembly will take place on **Thursday, November 8**th @ 2:00 p.m.

SO ACTIVE, SO HEALTHY COMMITTEE

There is a chill in the air, but the sun still shines golden and cozy. It's that 'in between' weather where it's cool enough for a warm woolly sweater and warm enough for those mid afternoon walks or backyard soccer games! Whatever physical activity you choose, get active with your kids and take advantage of these not-so-cold days. After all, the inevitable deepfreeze is coming! So save the 'cuddle up and watch our favorite movie' days and **get outside** and **get active**!

Remember to re-fuel after an activity with wise snack choices containing carbohydrates. Here is a list of a few items that are easy to prepare and at hand;

- Fresh fruit, carrot sticks or other veggies
- o Unsweetened apple sauce or fruit cups
- o Crackers
- o Dry whole grain cereal
- Low fat banana bread or muffin

You can even get the little ones involved with making simple snacks such as these:

Ants on a log: Celery sticks filled with peanut butter/nut butter and topped with raisins **Banana Roll-ups:** Spread peanut butter/nut butter on a whole-wheat tortilla and wrap around a banana.

Lastly, don't forget to stay hydrated and simply HAVE FUN!

LOW FAT BANANA BREAD RECIPIE

2/3 cup white sugar
1/4 cup margarine, softened
2 eggs
1 cup mashed bananas
1/4 teasp
1/4 cup water
1 2/3 cup
1 teaspoor
1/2 teasp
1/4 teasp

1 2/3 cups all-purpose flour 1 teaspoon baking soda 1/2 teaspoon salt 1/4 teaspoon baking powder



Directions

Preheat oven to 350 degrees F (175 degrees C).

Spray one 9x5x3 inch loaf pan with a non-stick cooking spray.

In a medium bowl, beat the white sugar and margarine or butter until smooth and creamy.

Beat in the eggs, water and bananas with the sugar mixture until it is well blended.

Mix in the flour, baking soda, salt and baking powder just until the mixture is moistened.

Be sure to scrape the sides of the bowl to blend all ingredients.

Bake at 350 degrees F (175 degree C) for about 60 minutes.

Bread is done when the top is firm to the touch and a golden brown color. Time will vary according to loaf size and oven type. When bread is removed from oven, allow it to cool on it's side for 10 minutes, then remove from pan and let cool on a rack. This bread is also excellent if you add mini chocolate chips or small fruit pieces to the mix just before baking.
